

## **Shanty Talk: Spring on the Mountain**

hough I've not been up to my favorite mountains this spring, L'm sure, with the amount of snowfall, the upper Hudson will be full as will a number of rivers here in the northeast. Rather, my time has been spent on my day job and keeping up with my reading of the several hobby periodicals to which I subscribe. This is in addition to some train shows, upgrading my ALCO talk and making a trip or two into my basement to work on my rolling stock. That is, in between snow removal duties.

As I get older, I've lost a step or two so I end up getting less done in the time I have available. Consequently, I'm envious and amazed at my colleagues who've managed to construct some wonderful and inspiring layouts. I spent some time operating on them as part of Rail Run that was originally fostered by the late Bill Borelli. He contributed much to the HUB, the Boston and Maine Operators group, Rail Run, and of course, the Tour de Chooch held on Thanksgiving weekends. Bill is no longer with us, but his legacy remains as one who enriched the lives of many model railroaders and the public alike. I was pleased to see Keith Shoneman receive the Borelli Award this year for his effort to promote the hobby through opening his layout to the public and becoming the Chairman of Tour de Chooch for 2013, among other things.

spring version of the public layout tour promoted by Ray Schofield in Southeastern New England will have been held on April 13, 2013. encourage everyone to participate in these events and to show your appreciation for the efforts these people go to in making their homes available to visitors. There are several other unique events coming up in addition to our monthly Railfun. The first is the Saratoga and North Creek Train Excursion on May 18th, put together by our own Dick Towle. Now back to the modeling. Years ago I built an EMD FT from a Cary kit painted and lettered for the B&M maroon scheme. With its modified Athearn frame and metal casting, it is a real brute. It is also the main reason I've shifted to working with plastic-shelled models instead of metal castings. The number of tiny broken drill bits and my lack of fingerprints from pin vises should be self explanatory. I never did get around to adding the final window detail until recently. For the window portals I used a leather punch to get the nearest size diameter from thin, clear

By the time many of you read this, the sheet styrene. For the windshield, I traced the window outlines on a 3M sticky note pad sheet, then transferred it to thin clear sheet styrene. Using "Micro Kristal Klear' window material I placed a bead around the window opening and then gently set the styrene window piece (attached to a sliver of that same sticky note for handling purposes) into place and let it dry overnight. The Kristal Klear is an acrylic that dries clear so it is indistinguishable from the thin window material. The sticky note material is easily removable, leaving the window in place.

> While beginning a Gloor Craft wooden D&H caboose kit, I discovered the windows are incorrect and, because I have several kits, they are an ideal candidate to be cast. While I've constructed several prototypes for a casting, I don't believe I can make a mold and get the part out!!!!! So it's back to the drawing board working with negative spaces. I'll let you know how that works out. Right now, since I'm moving slower I'd better get cracking or the spring chores will never get done and I'll have no time for my favorite hobby.



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

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
